Further Guidelines

- All uniform must be named, clean and in good repair
- A Maroon St Meryl Book Bag is required in Reception and KS1 for transporting reading books, letters, lunch and water bottles to and from school. Children in KS2 may bring a school bag of their choice
- Nail varnish and make-up may not be worn and must be removed if worn,
 Fingernails must be cut to an appropriate length, and false nails may not be worn.
- Long hair on both boys and girls must be tied back during PE lessons
- Hairstyles must be neat, smart and appropriate for school. Dyed hair is not permitted, unless on "special" days (eg: Sports Relief)
- Watches are allowed but must be removed for P.E. and swimming
- If earrings are worn, they must be studs which must be removed or taped over for P.E. and swimming (parents must provide tape)

- No other jewellery is permitted
- The school respects cultural dress and the uniform may be modified accordingly in consultation with the Head Teacher.
- If any pupil arrives at school dressed inappropriately, the Head Teacher reserves the right to send the child home to change

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
